'AMERICA IN THE MOVIES' FALL FILM SERIES PREMIERS OCTOBER 13

The 2011 Friends of the Library film series, "America in the Movies", will feature American film classics which deal with specific episodes in American history: the Revolutionary War, the Civil War, the Indian Wars, World Wars I and II, the Great Depression, and Watergate. Included in the series are films by some of the greatest Hollywood directors including John Ford, Howard Hawks, and Raoul Walsh. In addition, many of Hollywood's all time favorite actors will be seen: Henry Fonda, Errol Flynn, Olivia de Havilland, Gary Cooper, Dustin Hoffman, and Robert Redford.

Brief introductions to the films will be presented by Charles Vahlkamp who also will lead discussions following each film. Discussions will focus on each film as to the truth of its version of the historical events depicted, and look at the films as a reflection of the time at which they were released. Films begin October 13 and continue through December 8. All films will be shown at 7 pm on Thursday nights in the Library's Community Room. Admission is FREE and popcorn will be provided.

October 13 – Introductory comments with several brief excerpts from D.W. Griffith's **Birth of a Nation** (1915). Griffith, a native Kentuckian, claimed that his film was the utter truth, and President Woodrow Wilson agreed with him. The film tells the story of two families, one Southern and one Northern, during the time of the War Between the States and Reconstruction.

October 20 – **Drums Along the Mohawk**, (John Ford, 1939), 103 min., with Henry Fonda and Claudette Colbert. Upstate New York is the setting for this film which tells the story of a young couple trying to establish a homestead in the midst of the tumultuous events beginning in 1776.

October 27 - **Young Mr. Lincoln**, (John Ford, 1939), 100 min., with Henry Fonda. Young Abraham leaves his home in Kentucky and seeks a career as a lawyer in Illinois.

November 3 – **They Died With Their Boots On**, (Raoul Walsh), 140



min., with Errol Flynn, Anthony Quinn, and Olivia De Havilland. General Custer's campaign against Chief Crazy Horse in 1876 meets with disaster.

November 10 – **Sergeant York**, (Howard Hawks, 1941), 134 min., with Gary Cooper and Walter Brennan. A backwoods boy from Tennessee overcomes his aversion to violence and becomes a hero in World War I.

November 17 – **Golddiggers of 1933**, (Mervyn LeRoy, 1934), 97 min., with Joan Blondell, Dick Powell, and Ginger Rogers. Young actors are faced with loss of employment during the Great Depression. They find a solution to their problem with the help of a young composer who wants to write a new musical.

December 1 – **Our Daily Bread**, (King Vidor, 1934), 80 min., with Tom Keene and Karen Morley. The major studios refused to make this film because of its strong political content. The film tells the story of people displaced by the Depression who decide to form their own community with its own legal and political system.

December 8 – **All the President's Men**, (Alan Pakula, 1976), 138 min., with Dustin Hoffman and Robert Redford. This is the "true" story of two reporters, Deep Throat and the events leading up to the resignation of Richard Nixon in 1974.

Trustees Pass Long-Range Plan, Set Six Goals to Move Library's Mission Forward

At the July Board meeting, the Library trustees passed unanimously the Long-Range Plan recommended by the LRP Committee. After eight months of study, interviewing other agencies, exploring outreach options, and polling the public, the committee distilled the five-year plan into six broad goals:

- Expand outreach programs and community partnerships
- Strengthen staff organization, training and communication
- Significantly increase awareness of the library's resources and services
- Develop a broader spectrum of programs and services
- Cultivate a superior collection of materials in multiple formats

- Be a welcoming library

Along with the plan, the committee submitted lists of recommendations supporting each goal. These ranged from expanded hours, hiring more staff, increasing parking and green space, improving marketing and media relations, adding emphasis on teens and youth, and exploring new technologies.

All of the goals and objectives serve the mission of the Boyle County Public Library, which seeks to engage the community by promoting life-long learning, by connecting people to information and technologies, and by contributing to local cultural life. In short, the BCPL will work intentionally to become a significant player in the life of Boyle County.

Library Offers Over 7,600 e-Books, Music & Films Through Website

Now you can read and listen to books, listen to music and watch movies on your electronic devices by downloading them for FREE through Boyle County Public Library's website, www.boylepublib.org.

The Library has joined Kentucky Libraries Unbound, a consortium of 56 public libraries that pool funds and share a collection of over 7,600 titles in a variety of formats.

Download them to your laptop, smartphone, eReader, or MP3 player. Checkouts of downloadable items increase each month as smartphones (I-phones, Blackberries) and e-Readers (Nook, Sony Reader) become more popular. By late Fall, Kindle users will be able to download items as well. Since April BCPL patrons have checked out over 1,100 electronic titles. Library's gift makes headlines in Carrick Times

Travelers from Carrickfergus's sister city of Danville, Kentucky, presented the Carrickfergus town library with a number of books, a gift from the Boyle Co. Public Library, during their August visit to Ireland. Nyla Wright, Friends of the Library "Ambassador", presented books written by four of Danville's home-grown authors.

Assistant Library Director Georgia DeAraujo reported that the Carrick Times story was mentioned in the Kentucky Library News Digest, published weekly by staff at the State Library.

The publications include two volumes of poetry, Bucolics by Maurice Manning and Isaac Murphy: I Dedicate This Ride by Frank X Walker, and two children's books, That Book Woman by Heather Henson and Perfect Timing by Patsi Trollinger.

An article about the visit and gift appeared in the August 4, 2011 issue of Carrick Times. and noted: That Book Woman tells the story of one of the the Pack Horse Librarians of the 1930s, a group who delivered books to remote areas throughout Kentucky and other parts of the US.

Wright also shared greetings from Library Director Karl Benson and his staff with Fiona McCallum, Libraries NI (Northern Ireland) area manager who said, "It was lovely to receive the books, particularly the two for children which are beautifully illustrated," McCallum added, "We've swapped email addresses with staff members of Boyle County Library; it's a great opportunity to keep in touch and share details of good practice."

New Book Sales Area Opens

A new book sales spot, provided by Friends of the Library, opened inside the library. The book display and sales area is arranged along the corridor past the circulation desk and to the left, near the restrooms. Sale shelves on the right hand wall below the large bulletin board display a variety of books for sale. Book prices that begin at \$1 are found just inside the book cover on the upper right. To pay for a book, the buyer simply places money for the selected books in a metal "honor system" box mounted on the wall above the book sales shelves.

In the first month over 92 books have sold. Friends of the Library ongoing book sales will complement the semi-annual book sales to generate funds that support library special programs, and purchase equipment and new technology for use in the library. Watch for an announcement of the next book sale coming in November.
